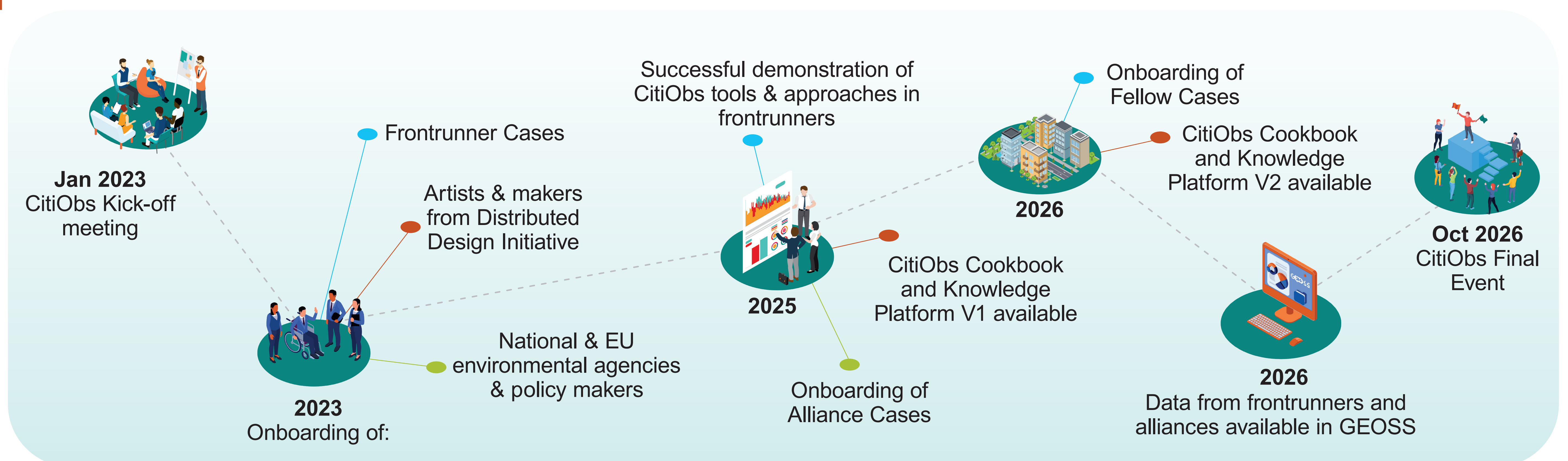

DESCRIPTION

CitiObs is the project that reimagines the role of citizens in the environmental governance process. The project is creating a set of sociotechnical tools to encourage inclusive participation in environmental observations and it is aggregating, standardizing and validating the data from these observations into visible and reliable results. Starting the cooperation with the frontrunner cases, existing COs in 5 cities, the project will collaborate with 85 cases of Citizen Observatories in order through a mutual learning process to enhance, support and connect them, so they can provide the insights that lead to actions and policy decisions.
